REQUIREMENTS AND SETUP

It's ideal to have an even amount of people so that you can choose to play as two teams, but if you don't you can play as individuals.

You can choose to set a theme, such as Christmas songs and/or Christmas movies, then print the above pages and cut out the white squares. Place these squares into a bowl to be drawn out of by players. We recommend a 2 minute time limit in order to make this game even more exciting.

RULES FOR TEAM CHARADES

Firstly, you're going to choose a player from your team to draw a piece of paper from the bowl.

Secondly, the player has to act out what topic it falls under. Ehow.com suggests a few gestures, but you can alter these actions as you wish:

a book: put your hands together, palms facing upwards.

a movie: pretend like you're winding up an old recording camera.

a person: put your hands on your hips.

a song: put your hands in the air and pretend to sing.

Next, the person has to indicate the number of words in the object he is going to act out. This can be done by showing the number of words with your fingers.

The person then has to act out the object without making a sound. If there is more than 1 word, indicate which word you are going to act out. The team who gets the most words right is the winner.
